Educational Visits

In November the whole School went to Leiston Film Theatre and saw the movie 'inside out'. This was an excellent experience and the film itself provided some useful opportunities for discussion in class, especially in PSHE lessons. In December Red Class visited the Wolsey Theatre to see a performance and the other Children enjoyed a visit to the Pantomime. It was very pleasing to receive an email from a member of the public, congratulating our pupils on their behaviour.

More recently (May 23rd) the whole school have visited Framlingham Castle which links directly to our theme this term 'Castles and Castle Life'. The theme has driven the curriculum and provided a focus for our writing and history work as well as drama.

The Egg

Shortly after the Autumn half term holiday children were amazed to see a giant egg in the school hedgerow. The project lasted a week and involved visits from a 'professor', the local vets and a 'Journalist' (thanks to them all for their help). The project certainly encouraged the pupils 'embrace wonder' and most importantly gave them a reason produce some excellent pieces of writing.

Sports and Competitions

Pupils have represented the school in the following competitions: Sports Hall Athletics, Basketball, gymnastics, football and Tag Rugby. A Hockey match against Year 7 Pupils at Debenham High School resulted in a convincing victory for Earl Soham. Thanks to DHS for hosting and selecting an appropriate team. All teams have made a very good job of representing the school and it was especially pleasing that one of the Gymnastics teams won their event and have progressed to the county final (8th July 2016).

Sports Relief (March 2016)

The School council organised a day of events including: come to school in sports kit/dressed as a sports star, a penny trail (spelling out Sports Relief 2016 on the Hall floor) and a 'danceathon'. The children organised this themselves with support from staff. £127.08 was raised.

Poetry and a live broadcast

In the Spring Term Pupils were treated to a live poetry performance and workshops when Adisa the Verbaliser visited the school. This inspired some excellent poetry which formed part of our Radio Broadcast on Radio Castle. Whist Blue class were broadcasting live from the studio the rest of the school listened to them back at school. Many parents (and other relatives) also listened to the broadcast either live or using a playback facility.

Curriculum Information Evening

At the start of the Summer term the school held a curriculum information evening for parents. The discussion covered the main changes to assessment, concentrating on Writing and Grammar. Parents were shown typical work from our pupils and the national exemplars. They also had an opportunity to look at the example Grammar Tests for years 2 and 6. The evening was well received.

Robin Hood

Last week the children put on a production of Robin Hood which was exceptionally well received. There were three performances and all of the children were involved as they sang and act out the story of Robin and the Sheriff of Nottingham. Thanks are due to all staff for their hard work and in particular Mrs Elliott who directed the play.

School Council

The school council (a group of elected pupil representatives) have shown considerable resilience in organising their own Educational Visit. Earlier in the year they asked to go to Banham Zoo. Since then they have been busy raising funds to finance their venture. A cake sale was held and the proceeds reduced the entry charge to £1 per pupil which parents paid. They also sent representatives to the PTFA meeting to request support with the cost of the transport. The whole school really enjoyed the trip to the zoo on Wednesday July 6th. The pupils have developed an appreciation that it is necessary to work towards a goal.

PTFA (Parents, Teachers and Friends Association).

The PTFA have been very busy organising events and more importantly raising funds. The most recent events were a Glow party (Disco) for the children and the annual fayre. They have raised in excess of £5000 this year and the school is very thankful for their continued support.
