NW the green is used by a lot of the public to sit and enjoy our village. Another member of the public asked if it would be a nice idea to install a bench.

- Update on current projects Defibrillator to be fitted at surgery ASAP, we have received a grant of £1500 for village green posts due to lockdown start of installation delayed until July/ August, we found out that we didn't own the phone box but adoption had been started, Fido bin to be ordered and fitted near tennis court, highways hadn't come back about SID installation
- 9 COVID 19 GH we have raised in excess of £4600 made up of £2500 grants and the rest donations from the village this money is being held by the council and is being used for people in hardship and schooling needs/equipment.
- Neighbourhood Plan update CS There has not been a lot of activity these last weeks due to lockdown. We have received draft releases of the site assessments and housing needs analysis. Our consultant has identified several inconsistencies in the reports which need to be clarified and for obvious reasons all this dialogue is taking longer than it would normally. We are still waiting for the Design guide from AECOM. I hope that as we come out of lockdown we will be able to pick up on activities.
